# SCHOLARSHIP AWARD GUIDELINES: STUDIO ART

The Department of Art and Art History is accepting applications for 2024-2025 studio art scholarships.

- PDF applications are due by **noon** on **Friday, January 26, 2024** via email to the following address: <u>uaartscholarship@ua.edu</u>.
- All applicants will also hang their work for review by the faculty.
  - Foundations and Intermediate students should plan to hang their work in Woods Hall between 8 and 10am on February 9, and to deinstall that day from 2 to 5.
  - Advanced students will hang their work early, in the SGAG on Feb. 1-2 and deinstall Feb. 12.
- Submit application components as a <u>single pdf</u> saved as lastname\_firstname\_art.pdf. Do not submit multiple attachments.
- Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.

## **Eligibility requirements:**

- Declared ART major with at least 3 ART credit hours completed at UA
- Minimum 2.5 overall GPA and 3.0 GPA in ART+ARH courses
- Full-time enrollment at UA as an ART major for at least one semester of the 2024-2025 academic year (Fall 2024, Spring 2025, Summer 2025)
- Previous scholarship recipients are eligible and encouraged to apply.

# **Scholarship Policies:**

- Awards are given as monetary scholarships toward tuition for the 2024-25 academic year only.
- Awards may <u>not</u> be applied to Summer 2024 courses.
- Students who will graduate in December 2024 may receive half funding.

## **Applicant Categories:**

Applicants will be placed into categories relative to their completed credit hours and will be judged with other ART majors at the same level.

#### Instructions for Portfolio Review

Faculty members and/or graduate assistants will be present to assist and supervise installation.

- Physical work is preferred, but photographic reproductions may be submitted if original work is unavailable.
- Applicant can submit up to SIX works produced in UA ART classes.\*
- Work from a course in progress may be submitted.
- Works do not need to be framed, but should be clean and presentable.
- Each piece should have a corresponding information card with:

Title of piece (optional)	
Medium (charcoal on paper, digital print, aluminum, etc.)	
Course title, instructor's name, and semester in which the work was comple	etec
Short description of the project or assignment (optional)	

- Each student will be assigned an individual area to thoughtfully present their portfolio.
- Students are responsible for providing the necessary materials and tools for creating the presentation (push pins, pedestals, etc.). If a student is unable to hang or deinstall their work, arrangements must be made for a representative to install it.
- Students who wish to show work that requires special equipment (digital media) should consult their instructor in advance about the best way to present it. Often the department and/or gallery can assist in providing this, but this should be requested and scheduled in advance of installation day.

<sup>\*</sup>Work completed at other institutions may be considered but must receive preapproval by scholarship coordinator. At least 4 pieces must have been completed at UA. Email Rachel Stephens at rachel@ua.edu for approval or questions or concerns.

## **Written Component**

On the day of the review, a brief written component is required of all students. This is a very important part of the portfolio review.

Responses should be typed in 14 pt. font, printed out, and hung next to the piece discussed.

What do you think is your strongest piece and why? (100 words or less)

## Intermediate -

Choose the strongest piece in your portfolio and write a <u>short critical analysis</u> using art vocabulary. (200 words or less)

#### Advanced -

Choose the strongest piece in your portfolio and write a <u>short critical analysis</u> using art vocabulary. (200 words or less)

AND

Select a piece from your portfolio that best expresses a concept / idea, and describe the relationship between the concept / idea and your work. (200 words or less)
